Gennady Afanasyev, a professional photographer and Crimean activist, took part in the movement for a united Ukraine during the annexation of the Crimean peninsula by the Russian Federation. But in 2014 he was arrested in Simferopol and he was tried in the case of so-called Crimean terrorists. He was illegally detained in Russian prisons as a political prisoner.

He now lives in Kyiv and continues to fight for the release of Ukrainian political prisoners illegally detained in Russia.

Iryna Vovk is a journalist, since 2010 she has worked as an editor, correspondent and documentary filmmaker in the editorial offices of the ZIK news agency, TV channels 24 and ZIK. Since April 2014, she has been in the combat zone in Donbas: as a journalist and volunteer for the Ukrainian military. She headed the Charitable Foundation “24” (assistance to Ukrainian soldiers) in 2014—2015. From the end of 2016, she recorded conversations with the families of Ukrainian soldiers killed in the Donbas, which were included in the three-volume “On the Shield. Memories of the families of fallen soldiers”.

Since March 2020, she has recorded conversations with Ukrainians released from captivity on December 29, 2019, which were included in the book “Isolation. Secret prisons of Donbass in stories saved from torture and death”.

Daria Bura is a journalist who has worked as a freelance correspondent for several Lviv publications since 2008.

Since 2014, she has written texts related to the war in eastern Ukraine (the site of TV channel “24”). Since the end of 2015, she has been in the combat zone in Donbas as a volunteer of the Return Alive Charitable Foundation (assistance to Ukrainian soldiers). Since 2017 — freelance journalist, author of articles in Ipress.ua, Fakty.ictv.ua, Charitable Foundation “Come back alive”; from 2019 — in the editions “Without Armor”, ‘Novynarnia’. Since March 2018 — radio host on the military radio MOU “Army FM”.

In March 2020, she began to record conversations with Ukrainians released from captivity on December 29, 2019. These stories are included in the book “Isolation. Secret prisons of Donbass in stories saved from torture and death”.

FEBRUARY 20, 2015

■ News Round-Up

For the past 24hrs, two servicemen were killed and three were injured in the Anti-Terrorist Operation (ATO) zone. This was stated by Vladislav Seleznyov, acting spokesman for the *Armed Forces General Staff*. Seleznyov also reported that at withdrawal of troops from Debaltseve, Donetsk Oblast, fighters of the ATO forces took out all mobile equipment.

- ✈ During the night, the militants fired 15 times at the positions of the Ukrainian military, and during the day they violated the 'peace and quiet' order a total of 49 times.

The main blow of gunmen on the night of February 20 fell in the Donetsk direction; they also fired at Berdyanske, in the Mariupol direction, — the *ATO press center* reports.

Thus, in the Donetsk direction, Avdiivka and Tonenke were fired at with multiple rocket launchers. The village of Kurakhovo was hit with 'Hrad' rockets. In the area of Opitne, militants used armored vehicles. The enemy fired artillery and mortars at Vodyane.

In the Mariupol direction, criminals fired small arms and mortars at Berdyanske.

- ✈ For the past days, at least 4 supply convoys from Russia to the territory of militants in Donbas are recorded to arrive. In total up to 55 transport units, and also 28 units of military equipment, including tanks, BBM and self-propelled artillery, — writes *Dmytro Timchuk, the organizer of "Informatsiyeni Sprotiv" Group* (Information resistance). He notes that around Donetsk the artillery of militants struck blows onto positions of the ATO forces.

- ✈ The area of Luhansk Oblast controlled by Ukraine lost one settlement due to hostilities — Chornukhyne, Popasnyansky District. The Ukrainian Armed Forces were forced to leave the village, and militants of the so-called "LNR" (Luhansk People's Republic) entered there, according to the website of Gennadiy Moskal, the head of the *Luhansk Oblast State Administration* (OSA).

FEBRUARY 21, 2015

■ News Round-Up

Militants continue to fire at Avdiivka. Three residents died. This was announced by Vyacheslav Abroskin, the head of the *Donetsk Oblast Police Department*. According to him, three men died due to a direct hit by a shell into the "Brevno" cafe, in the Industrial Passage area.

- ✍ In the *ATO press center* they specified that for the past days nobody was killed, but 7 fighters are wounded. Earlier, the ATO spokesman Colonel Andriy Lysenko reported that for the past days one Ukrainian military was killed and 40 more were wounded during Anti-Terrorist Operation (ATO) in Donbas.
- ✍ The militants are increasing their presence in the Mariupol direction. Perhaps they are preparing an offensive on Mariupol. The *spokesman for the ATO* Andriy Lysenko declared it. "In the Mariupol direction, there is an increase in the amount of military equipment, weapons and manpower of the enemy in order to possibly attack the city of Mariupol" — he said.
- ✍ Militants increased activity in the Donetsk direction. The *ATO press center* reports about it. Militants fired at the village of Pisky with tank weapons and infantry fighting vehicles, with artillery and mortars. In addition, terrorists fired at Tonenke and Opytne with multiple rocket launchers. In the Mariupol direction, using tanks, mortars and grenade launchers, the criminals fired on the village of Shyrokinе. In the area of Debaltseve, near the villages of Lozove and Leninske, a gang fired small arms at Ukrainian strongpoints. In total, the enemy fired at the positions of Ukrainian troops and peaceful settlements 32 times during the day.

FEBRUARY 22, 2015

■ News Round-Up

In the morning, an attack on the ATO force positions began in Shyrokinе. Dmytro Chaly, the *press officer of sector "M"* reported about it, as communicated by "0629.com.ua".

According to him, at 7:00 Ukrainian military positions located in Shyrokinе were attacked using a tank, anti-aircraft guns and small arms. There are no casualties among servicemen.

According to the information, Russian Air Force planes reappeared in the sky over sector "M". The flight was carried out by two reconnaissance aircrafts.

- ✍ One Ukrainian serviceman was killed and three were injured in the past 24 hours. This was announced by the *ATO spokesman* Andriy Lysenko. According to him, during the past day the intensity of hostilities in the ATO zone decreased.

- ✍ An explosion occurred in the center of Kharkiv during a peaceful march. Two people were killed and 11 were injured in a terrorist attack in Kharkiv. Such data is provided by the website of the *Kharkiv OSA*.

FEBRUARY 23, 2015

■ News Round-Up

- The militants continue to increase the number of forces and military equipment in the direction of Mariupol. *Dmytro Timchuk*, *people's deputy (MP) and organizer of "Informatsiyni Sprotiv" Group* (Information resistance), posted about it on Facebook in the morning.
- ✍ During the night, the gunmen opened fire twice — the attack on Shyrokyne lasted for half an hour. This was reported by the ATO press center. During the last 24 hours, 2 Ukrainian servicemen were killed and 10 got wounded in the ATO zone. This was announced by Colonel Valentin Fedichev, *Deputy Head of the ATO in Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts*.
- ✍ The coke plant of the "Metinvest" Group was fired upon in Avdiivka. The truce lasted for two days. This was reported on the *company's website*.
- ✍ Ukrainian troops control the towns of Svitlodarsk and Luhanske after withdrawing forces from Debaltseve. This was announced by the deputy head of the ATO in Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts, *Colonel Valentin Fedichev*.

FEBRUARY 24, 2015

■ News Round-Up

- Massive shelling of Ukrainian troops and civilian targets has continued in the Shyrokyne area over the past 24 hours. *Dmytro Tymchuk*, the organizer of the "Informatsiyni Sprotiv" Group (Information resistance), wrote about this on Facebook.
In the Novoazovsk direction, the enemy pulls up armored vehicles (movement of 4 tanks along the T0508 route was recorded).
- ✍ During the day, one serviceman was killed and 7 others were wounded in the ATO zone. This was reported by the ATO spokesman Colonel Andriy Lysenko. According to him, terrorists are transferring equipment and manpower in the Mariupol direction.
- ✍ During the night of February 23—24 militants fired on the ATO forces positions 12 times, the ATO press center reports.
The largest number of cases of 'peace and quiet' order violation is in the Debaltseve direction. The enemy fired artillery at the village of

Popasna and the village of Luhanske. At night, gunmen fired artillery and mortars at Opytne, Tonenke, and Avdiivka in the Donetsk direction. In the Mariupol direction, gangs continue to attack our positions near the village of Shyrokyne.

- ✍ Another man, 18-year-old Mykola Melnychuk, who was injured in an explosion during a march on Sunday, died in Kharkiv. This was reported on Facebook by *Anton Gerashchenko*, an adviser to the Minister of Internal Affairs.
- ✍ The foreign ministers of the “Quartet of Normandy” in Paris could not agree on the situation in Debaltseve. This was stated by *Ukrainian Foreign Minister Pavlo Klimkin* following the meeting, the BBC reports. “Unfortunately, there was no political decision on how to deal with what happened in Debaltseve,”— Klimkin said.

FEBRUARY 25, 2015

■ News Round-Up

During the last 24 hours, one Ukrainian serviceman was wounded in the ATO zone, there are no casualties. This was announced by the *ATO spokesman Andriy Lysenko*.

- ✍ The militants are trying to attack in the area of Mariynka, Pisky, Opytne and Avdiivka, Donetsk Oblast. This was announced by *Dmytro Tymchuk*, the organizer of the “Informatsiyeni Sprotiv” Group (Information resistance) on Facebook.
- ✍ The bodies of seven Ukrainian servicemen were found under the rubble of the Donetsk airport. This was announced on Facebook by *Vasyl Budyk*, an employee of the Center for the Liberation of Prisoners of the Armed Forces of Ukraine.

FEBRUARY 26, 2015

■ News Round-Up

At night, gunmen fired only in the Donetsk direction, in particular, Pisky was fired with small arms, and ATO forces became attacked by shelling near Butivka Mine. This was reported by the *ATO press center*. During the day, gunmen fired 7 times at the ATO force positions and peaceful settlements with small arms, twice with tank weapons and once with mortars.

- ✍ During the past 24hrs, there were no casualties among Ukrainian servicemen in the ATO zone, 4 Ukrainian servicemen were wounded. The *spokesman for the ATO Headquarters*, Colonel Andriy Lysenko, reported about it.

- ✍ Ukraine begins withdrawing heavy weapons. This is stated in the message of the General Staff. According to the report, the withdrawal of 100-mm guns from the demarcation line begins.

FEBRUARY 27, 2015

■ News Round-Up

During the last 24 hours, three Ukrainian servicemen were killed and seven were injured in the ATO zone. This was announced by Colonel Andriy Lysenko, the ATO spokesman.

- ✍ Russia has concentrated 63.5 thousand troops near the border with Ukraine. This was reported by the *"Informatsiyni Sprotiv"* Group (Information resistance).

FEBRUARY 28, 2015

■ News Round-Up

Last night, illegal armed formations fired with 'Hrad' rockets on Avdiivka, Tonenke, and Opytne, Donetsk Oblast. However, in the area of Luhanske, near Debaltseve, the battle continued with the use of small arms. This was reported at the *press center of the Anti-Terrorist Operation*.

- ✍ In the ATO zone, despite the 'peace and quiet' order and withdrawal of heavy weapons from the confrontation line, on February 28 there is an intensification of gangs in the Donetsk direction. According to the *ATO press center*, against the background of a general decrease in enemy shelling of ATO positions in Luhanske, Mariupol and Debaltseve, terrorists periodically fired at ATO positions in the direction of Donetsk during the day.

MARCH 1, 2015

■ News Round-Up

In the ATO zone on the night of March 1—from midnight till 6 am—attacks by terrorists aren't recorded. This was reported at the *press center of the Anti-Terrorist Operation*.

- ✍ During March 1, militants violated the ceasefire 17 times. According to the *ATO press center*, the terrorists concentrated their activity in the Donetsk direction, where 8 cases of shelling of ATO positions and peaceful settlements were recorded.

- ✈ On the night of February 28, a large convoy of Russian military equipment passed through Lutihine, Luhansk Oblast. This was reported in the special battalion “Azov”.
“The group consisted of a large number of tanks and trucks with infantry. Field kitchens and other means of supply were also noticed. The vehicle was moving from the village of Pervozvanivka in the direction of Luhansk”, — it is noted in the message.
- ✈ For the past 24hrs, there’ve been no casualties among Ukrainian servicemen, yet 8 were injured. Andriy Lysenko, the *spokesman for the ATO Headquarters* declared it.

MARCH 2, 2015

■ News Round-Up

Militants in Donbas continue to grossly violate the Minsk peace agreements by shelling Ukrainian military positions and civilian targets. This was announced by *Dmytro Tymchuk*, the *head of the “Informatsiyni Sprotiv” Group* (Information resistance).

According to him, militants use artillery and heavy infantry weapons among others. In some areas, gunmen and Russian mercenaries are trying to carry out attacks on the forward positions of Ukrainian troops.

- ✈ During the past day, militants fired at the ATO force positions 32 times. This was reported by *Vladislav Seleznyov*, the acting chairman of the *General Staff press center*, at the briefing.
- ✈ Over the past 24 hours, one serviceman was killed and four were wounded in the ATO zone. This was announced during a briefing by *Andriy Lysenko*, the ATO spokesman.

MARCH 3, 2015

■ News Round-Up

During the last night in the ATO zone, militants broke the ‘peace and quiet’ order 6 times; they acted most actively in the direction of Donetsk. This was reported by spokesmen for the *ATO Headquarters and the General Staff of the Armed Forces*.

The most difficult situation is observed in the Donetsk direction near the Donetsk airport — there militants also fired on our positions located around Pisky, Opytne, Dutivska Mine, and Avdiivka.

- ✈ During the last 24 hours, 3 Ukrainian servicemen were killed and 9 others were injured in the ATO zone. *Colonel Andriy Lysenko*, the *ATO spokesman*, said about this.

MARCH 4, 2015

■ News Round-Up

Last night the positions of APU near Lebedinske, Chermalyk and in Shyrokyne were attacked. This was announced to "0629.com.ua" by Dmytro Chaly, a spokesman for the sector "M".

- ✍ For the past 24hrs, one serviceman was killed and another one was wounded in the ATO zone. This was announced by Andriy Lysenko, the *ATO spokesman*.
- ✍ Anti-terrorist operation forces began withdrawing 152-millimeter 'Acacia' artillery units from the confrontation line. This was reported by the *ATO press center*.
The Ukrainian side began withdrawing heavy weapons from the confrontation line. The ATO Headquarters has repeatedly emphasized that militants imitate the withdrawal of weapons and equipment.

MARCH 5, 2015

■ News Round-Up

During the past day, militants fired on the forces of the ATO and peaceful settlements 40 times, according to the *ATO press center*. Donetsk direction remains the hottest. Avdiivka, Opytne and Pisky came under fire with various weapons.

- ✍ One Ukrainian serviceman was killed and another was wounded in Donbas over the past 24 hours. Vladislav Seleznyov, the acting *spokesman for the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine*.
- ✍ In pursuance of the Minsk Agreements, the ATO forces continue to withdraw heavy weapons from the confrontation line. This was announced by the *ATO spokesman Colonel Andriy Lysenko*. According to him, the Armed Forces are ready to start withdrawing 'Hurricane' volley fire systems.
In the Luhansk Oblast, the Ukrainian side withdrew the missile and artillery divisions of the Armed Forces, which are armed with BM-21 multiple rocket launchers, to the distances stipulated by the Minsk Agreements. This was reported by the *Ministry of Defense press service*.
- ✍ The militants resumed work at the Debaltseve railway junction. This was announced by the *ATO spokesman Colonel Andriy Lysenko* "According to intelligence, the Debaltseve railway junction has been restored. The enemy uses it to transport weapons and military equipment to specified area. In particular, on March 3, unloading of wagons with ammunition was recorded at the station," Lysenko said.
